The Foundation for North American Wild Sheep (FNAWS) was incorporated as a non-profit corporation in 1977. FNAWS is actively involved in the conservation, propagation and intensive management of the remaining Wild Sheep populations and their habitats. Assistance is provided to a wide variety of meaningful and essential projects including: Buffer Land Acquisition, Wild Sheep Transplants, Biological Studies and Research Projects, Prudent Wild Sheep Management; Wildlife Habitat Improvement, Safeguard the Environment, Repress Poaching and Foster Sportsmen's Rights. Local projects that have received funding include University of Alberta Bear Mortality Study, Yarrow-Castle Bighorn Sheep Study, Dalls Sheep/Muskox Parasite Study and Cadomin Enforcement Plan.

The Foundation for North American Wild Sheep has eleven chapters throughout the United States of America and one Chapter in Alberta, Canada.
